MINUTES OF THE 2009 ALUMNI MEETING

The 117th annual Alumni Banquet was June 26, 2009 in the high school cafeteria. Once again, tours of the school were conducted for those who wished to see the recent renovations.

Prior to dinner, Pres. Jay A. Wilcox '55 introduced Stephen E. Kappesser '72, who gave the Invocation. He then proceeded to introduce this year's Wall of Distinction inductees: Ira P. Learned '58, Susan M, Bitz '70, Dr. Patricia Ledden-Chapman '70, and William Fowler '83. He thanked Bd. Pres. Creg T. Ivison and Supt. Stewart R. Amell for their continued support of the alumni association. He thanked the cafeteria staff, the custodians, the National Honor Society and all the students and staff at SCCS.

This year's inductees are (! to r): William Fowler '83, a teacher since 1990, at SCCS since 1996, who teaches over and beyond textbooks, making sure students are understanding the subject matter, a successful coach who has taken teams to State Finals and has been nominated for numerous Coach of the Year awards; Ira P. Leamed '58, taught industrial Arts for 34 years, operated "Art's & lke's Bikes", where he also taught students to learn a trade, a founding father of the Salmon River Hockey Assn., former officer of our alumni association, volunteer fire fighter, member of the Sandy Pond Sportsmen's Assn. and Community Park Assn., member and officer of the Boylston Snowmobile Club, member and trustee of the Pulaski Wesleyan Church, Eagle Scout, Boy Scout leader and while in Florida, volunteers with a local church, feeding the homeless; Susan Bitz, '70, a teacher at SCCS, who is a strong supporter of the students and community, involved in school drama productions and numerous other functions, involved in Little League, Dollars for Scholars and the Sandy Creek Teachers Assn.; Dr. Patricia Ledden-Chapman, '70, first woman to become a doctor from Sandy Creek, graduated Valedictorian of her class, Magna Cum Laude from Boston University graduate of SUNY Upstate Medical University and was the first graduate from Syracuse to be accepted into the Rochester Family Medicine Program. 



BLOCK LETTER DINNER

Historian Margaret Hollis Kastler

In 1950 and 1951, the first addition was made to the 1927 school building, so there was no gymnasium that school year. Also, in the fall of 1950, our coach, Fred Tully, resigned for health reasons. Martin Maurer was hired in December of 1950 as gym teacher and coach for the boys. The basketball team practiced in the gym at Mannsville School after supper and the Pulaski High School gym was used for home games. In spite of the hardship, Sandy Creek went on to win the Oswego-Jefferson League 14 to 0. (Baseball games were played at the Oswego County Fairgrounds because of the construction at the back of the school building.)

To show their appreciation to the basketball team, the cheerleaders decided to give them a banquet. The upstairs of the First Methodist Church was the site of the gala affair. Invitations were sent to Prof. and Mrs. Cole, the principal, Mr. and Mrs. Crichton, Mr. and Mrs. Maurer, Rev. and Mrs. Halstead and the basketball team. The gentlemen, including the team, arrived wearing suits or jackets and ties. The day was the hottest day of the year and the dining room at the church was stiffling hot -- no air conditioning in those days. One of the mothers cooked homemade spaghetti sauce and the young teenage girls proceeded to prepare the rest of the meal. The table was carefully set with salad that quickly wilted to a blob and butter that turned to liquid. The pasta, while cooking, stuck together in a gluey ball. The sauce scorched to the bottom of the pot and then the ice cream melted to flavored milk.

George Corse, the writer of a weekly column in the Sandy Creek News titled "As I See It", heard about the cheerleaders' disaster. In one of his next columns he stated that he believed the young people of our community and school should be recognized for their endeavors.

After his article, the Block Letter Dinner, honoring the athletic teams, was started and continued until 1975 when the assembly of 200 became too large for the Masonic Hall to accommodate. Among their speakers early in the 1960's, was Emie Davis, All-American football player and Heisman Trophy winner from Syracuse University, and, in 1965, champion boxer Carmen Basilio, who later inspired the construction of the International Boxing Hall of Fame in Canastota,

Members of the basketball team for 1950-1951 were Bob Bortles, Dick Brennan, Albert (Jake) Cole, Rich Curry, Odie Sayler, George Scott, Claire Soule, John Sprague. Norm Widrig, Dick Yerdon and Tom Yerdon.

The cheerleaders were Nancy Crast (Soule), Margaret Hollis (Kastler), Celestine Samson (Kerr), Jane Soule (Cowan) and Beverly Weston (Gilmour).
