

SANDY CREEK CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET NEWSLETTER FOR THE 2010—2011 PROPOSED BUDGET

Dear Sandy Creek Central School District Residents and Taxpayers:

Within please find the Annual School District's Budget Newsletter for the 2010-2011 School Year. Our purpose is to inform you on the important facts of the proposed school budget for next year. The Board of Education and Community Budget Committee have been working since January with an overall goal of keeping school taxes down but continuing to offer a quality educational program for our children. We are proposing three (3) propositions:

2010 - 2011 Proposed Budget Resolution

<u>Proposition No. 1</u> Shall the Board of Education of the Sandy Creek Central School District, Oswego County, New York, hereby authorize to expend the sums set forth in the proposed budget for 2010-2011 in the amount of \$21,482,941.00 and to levy the necessary school tax therefore?

The Board of Education and the Community Budget Liaison Committee held several work sessions to review present budget categories, program reductions and the Board of Education goals. The groups are proposing no program improvements and the following Staff Reductions based on declining enrollments:

Teaching Faculty: 1.0 Business Teacher, 1.0 Elementary/High School Art Teacher, .12 Foreign Language Teacher

Support Staff: 2.0 Special Education Aides, 2.0 Special Education Bus Aides, 1.0 Technology Aide

The proposed budget is a 0.29% <u>decrease</u> compared to the 2009-2010 school year. This also represents a tax levy change of 0.0% [for the third (3rd) year in a row].

RESERVE FUND RESOLUTION

Proposition No. 2 Shall the Board of Education be authorized to continue to fund the newly established (June 30, 2007) Ten (10) Year Capital Reserve from excess 09-10 General Fund Monies **up to a maximum** of \$250,000 for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2010?

Proposition 2 is requesting your continued support for the District's Capital Improvement Reserve Fund. Continuing to keep our campus up to date has been a goal of the Board of Education. The Board is asking for approval to take any left over money in this year's (09-10) budget <u>up to a maximum of \$250,000</u> and add it to our Capital Reserve Fund for future improvements to our campus facilities.

PROPERTY ACQUISITION RESOLUTION

Proposition No. 3 Shall the Board of Education purchase a 3.32+/- acre portion of a parcel adjacent to the school campus (Tax Map No.: 019.20-01-08, 94 Salisbury Street) for future use (possibilities include but not limited to energy projects, athletic facilities, expansion of parking) at a purchase price of \$5,000 and estimated closing costs of \$2,000 for a total not to exceed \$7,000 which is estimated to be the total cost thereof, and pay for the acquisition through the use of the funds in the Capital Reserve Fund in the amount not to exceed \$7,000.

Proposition 3 is requesting your support for the District's Capital Initiatives by acquiring property directly adjacent to the Bus Garage. The 3.32 + - acre parcel would be a valuable asset to the District for future use.

Thank you in advance for your consideration of these propositions.
